The number of degrees awarded at Chabot College rose by 103, or 8% between 2019-20 and 2020-21.

Which student groups contributed the most to this increase from 2019-2020 to 2020-2021?

Latinx students contributed the most degrees: they earned 554 of the 1,425 degrees awarded in 2020-21.


Filipinx students contributed the highest percentage rise: they earned 20% (or 22) more degrees in 2020-21.

Latinx students were awarded 84 more degrees in 2020-21, a 18% increase.

Asian students decreased their number of degrees: with 27 fewer degrees in 2020-21, a 9% decrease.

African American students decreased their number of degrees: with 24 fewer degrees in 2020-21, a 19% decrease.

White students were awarded 10 fewer degrees in 2020-21, a 7% decrease.
