Degrees by Major Race/Ethnicity Groups and Dreamers
Changes between 2020-2021 and 2021-2022

The number of degrees awarded at Chabot College rose by 57 or 4% between 2020-21 and 2021-22.

Which student groups contributed the most to this increase from 2020-2021 to 2021-2022?

Latinx students contributed the most degrees: they earned 532 of the 1,482 degrees awarded in 2021-22.


White students contributed the highest percentage rise: they earned 6% (or 8) more degrees in 2021-22.

African American students increased their number of degrees: with 6 more degrees in 2021-22, a 6% increase.

Latinx students were awarded 22 fewer degrees in 2021-22, a 4% decrease.

Filipinx students were awarded 20 fewer degrees in 2021-22, a 15% decrease.

Asian students decreased their number of degrees: with 3 fewer degrees in 2021-22, a 1% decrease.
